Caledonia Food Co-op at the Kingdom Taproom Wednesday, Nov. 20, 5-6 p.m.



Introducing the Caledonia Food Co-op

Last fall I received a note from St. Johnsbury resident Ed Behr inquiring if I would be interested in helping start a new food co-op in the St. Johnsbury area. As a farmer—my wife and I own Joe's Brook Farm and grow organic vegetables and strawberries—I had sold to co-ops on a weekly basis and had enjoyed shopping at them. I also thought they added value and wealth to their host communities. So I agreed to learn more, and quickly became part of a small group that met through the fall of 2018 to discuss need, research the start-up process, vision, develop a mission, and eventually select a name. On March 20, 2019, the Caledonia Food Co-op, Inc. was incorporated as a co-op in the State of Vermont.

Doing the spring of 2019, we partnered with the Town of St. Johnsbury to apply for a USDA RD grant to fund a market feasibility study and evaluate potential sites. We received the grant and will begin the study in early 2020.

This summer president of the co-op board Ed Behr resigned. During his time on the board, Ed moved the project forward, sometimes single handedly, with his energetic research and leadership, and is owed a sincere thank you for his efforts.
